Call to order – John Fincher – 2:50

All in attendance from the E Board

No minutes from last meeting – May 16 – hopefully getting by Christmas for approval.

Announcements will now be happening at the beginning of the meeting instead of at the end.

Steve Hartman - CC football team is 3-0 and in the top ten in the state. Playing MT. Sac this Saturday - Sept 22 at 1pm at Citrus.

Sarah Baltwer (sp?) – introduced new software possibilities for students in the library. Workshops will be scheduled to teach students how to use this new software.

John Vaughan – working with Language Arts faculty in helping to promote Of Mice and Men being presented in October in the Haugh and looking forward to working with all departments with other productions as well.

Presidents Report – John Fincher

Asked about liking the room – we could go back to old room next spring if we want.

Citrus College budget – Citrus has a 14 ½% reserve. More than expected.

Fall Conference – Oct. 12 in San Jose

Props 30 and 32

Prop 30 – if it passes – spring classes will be added

CC will need to get a loan due to a deferral from the state – not paying CC until June.

Sate issue – not a Citrus issue.

Cherie Brown asked why – answer – state is obligated to eventually pay us the money we are owed – but can hold on to it for other things until June if needed. 32 – if it passes – PAC money will not automatically be deducted – a check will need to be cut individually into the PAC.

Information has been provided by CTA to help promote passing 30 and defeating 32

Prop 38 – funding for K-12 – not community colleges – urge to vote no on this also.

Citrus is very active on passing 30 – Flash Mob is being created, etc. Does CCFA want to be involved?

Between 30 and 38 – whichever prop gets the most votes wins. Even if 30 passes but does not get as many votes as 38 – it will lose to 38.

Steve Hartman – question - PCC going to a trimester?

Bruce Langford responded - PCC has canceled Winter. Up in the air about their summer.

Bruce stated that at this time there is no talk about any semester cancellations at Citrus.

Negotiation Report – Bruce Langford

Passed out written documentation to expand upon the current budget situation.

Reviewed the 14 1/2% reserve

Reviewed the 2% raise and it's impact

Have budgeted for the loss of prop 30

150 classes will be able to be put back if prop 30 passes – but also – no more will be cut

If prop 30 loses.

FTES – cut from approx 13,000 to just over 10,000

Passed out information and reviewed the ongoing discussion about Departments.

Would not appear in the contract.

Before we start talking about department chairs – need to talk about departments.

Ken Guttman suggested that the department committee comes back with suggestions for the next meeting.

Faculty has received their sick leave reports.

Trying to get tech services to create a data base to help clarify sick leave documentation

with more accuracy.

Overload sick leave vs. sick days – several members wanted clarification.
